IMPACT OF MUSIC ON CHILDHOOD DEVELPMENT

Music and singing to your infant can have a major impact on their development. Singing to your child promotes bonding, encourages play, assists with transitions, listening skills, and language development, and teaches rhythm and rhyme. Here are some tips on how to use music at home:

- Use music that encourages vocabulary or following simple commands (i.e., Head, Shoulders...). This encourages listening skills and building vocabulary.
- Use manipulatives or visuals that are associated with songs.
 For example, animal puppets for 'Old McDonald Had a Farm.'
- Change the words to some familiar songs to introduce new vocabulary and keep things lively. For instance, instead of an itsy bitsy spider it can be a big giant spider.
- Use a familiar song or tune to help with transitions, clean up time, or teaching moments. You could use the tune of 'Mary Had a Little Lamb' and sing "This is how we brush our teeth, brush our teeth, brush our teeth. This is how brush out teeth before we go to bed."

MUSIC AND AUSTISM

Children with ASD are reported to have a strong preference for music compared to verbal material. Music has shown that it supports the cognitive. emotional, and social needs including mood management, personal development, and social inclusion of children with ASD. Please keep in mind that there are individuals with autism that have a hard time engaging in musical activities because of sensory aversions to certain sounds or textures. To assist this, modify the pitch, rhythm, and/or tempo of your singing, Noise reduction earmuffs are also helpful to decrease overstimulating sounds.
